The other eight ACAA schools represented in Oxford this weekend are: Cornerstone Christian (Decatur), Cullman Christian, Brooklane Baptist (Hueytown), Marshall Christian (Albertville), Chilton Christian (Jemison), Trinity Christian (Oxford), Victory Baptist (Millbrook), and Clay County Christian (Ashland).

Tuscaloosa Christian coach Alan Montgomery, whose Warrior teams won three straight state championships from 2011-2013, knows the importance of testing his team early. "I feel it is extremely beneficial for us to take what we have learned the previous three weeks and put it into play against different people in a game environment," stated Montgomery. "The practice environment becomes mundane. When put in a game environment, we will see how well we have retained what we learned and get a better feel of where we stand from a learning perspective."

When asked what he looks for most from his team this weekend, Montgomery had this to say: "I am looking for us to be in the correct places on the court during each phase of the game. We have many young players and I want to see how they respond to game situations and pressure. Also, I want to see how our team leadership is moving along."

Play begins Friday, August 7th, at Noon at Bynum Community Center. Teams will play in three different pools to determine seeding for Saturday. The championships for the three tier tournament begin at 1:00 PM on Saturday.
